
After unsuccessfully trying to find a museum home for it, we have decided to put the bed up for auction on Ebay.

On Friday, August 31, 2012, The Heinlein Society hosted an open party at Chicon 7, the 70<sup>th</sup> World Science Fiction Convention at the Hyatt Regency Chicago. The party theme was to honor Lazarus Long's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday, which is alleged to be November 11, 1912. In keeping with the party's theme, Director Deb Houdek Rule mandated that red be the main party color (clothing *and* food), and kilts be worn if possible.
